President Trump's return to office has accelerated the end of an 80-year era in foreign policy and international affairs and the transition away from the post-WWII international liberal world order. Although a new paradigm for global security, economics, trade, and diplomacy has not emerged, we are witnessing its creation with each passing news cycle. This has led to unprecedented volatility and unpredictability in almost every industry. The media industries are no exception. Trump has flipped over the chess board. No one can predict how it will be set up again. Josh Rogin will analyze the state of U.S. foreign policy, how the world is shifting to respond, and how that impacts the media.

Rogin is the Washington Post Intelligence's lead Global Security Analyst. Since 2016, he also has been a columnist in the Post's Global Opinions Section. His columns have broken news, provided insight and driven the Washington conversation around national security and foreign policy. Before joining the Post, Rogin reported for *Bloomberg View*, *The Daily Beast*, *Newsweek*, *Congressional Quarterly*, *Federal Computer Week magazine*, and Japan's *Asahi Shimbun*.

He has interviewed top world leaders, officials and decision makers including the Prime Minister of Japan, the Prime Minister of Pakistan, President Donald Trump, Vice President Kamala Harris, Indo-Pacific Commander Admiral Samuel Paparo, and others. He's the author of *Chaos Under Heaven: Trump, Xi, and the Battle for the Twenty-first Century*. Rogin earned a B.A. in International Affairs from George Washington University in 2001. He studied at Sophia University in Tokyo.
